Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about the county council's service priorities, and the Council Tax we charge. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and Council Tax.

Spending priorities

The budget for 2009/10 was set in February 2009, by the Council's previous administration: a new administration was elected in June 2009. The new administration then took decisions to amend some of the planned spending for the year, and spending plans for future years, but left the overall budget total and the Council Tax for the year to March 2010 unchanged. The budget figures in the rest of this information include the effect of the budget changes adopted by the new administration. The plans for future years include a commitment to have no Council Tax increase for the coming financial year 2010/11, commencing on 1 April 2010.

In this financial year April 2009 to March 2010 the county council will spend £1,788 million (or nearly £1.8 billion). Of that spending, £1,079 million comes from the government for specific services and from charges we make for certain services; the largest item within this is £689 million of government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £709 million. The table below shows the services we will spend this on.

Council Tax

Our spending is funded by business rates, revenue support grant and Council Tax. The first two of these are fixed amounts we receive from the government. We set Council Tax based on how much more than these amounts we need to cover our total spending.

The table below shows our funding for 2009/10.

For 2009/10 we set a spending budget of £709 million. We received £287 million from the government, leaving £422 million to be raised from Council Tax. This meant an annual Council Tax charge of £1,108.30 for a property in band D, an increase of 2.9% on the previous year. The Council Tax set by the county council is included together with the Council Tax set by your borough or district council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill sent out by your borough or district council.

Next year and beyond

The county council's cabinet on 1st September 2009 considered a report on the council's Medium Term Financial Strategy, in the light of the new administration's priorities and the potentially significant impact on public sector finances as a result of the "credit crunch". While financial forecasts beyond 2010/11 are difficult because of the absence of firm information about the level of central government support for local authorities, as well as the ongoing economic uncertainty, this report indicated that a range of savings of between £79m and £142m could be required over the four years to 2013/14. This is between 11% and 30% of the budget excluding schools funding which is ring fenced. Clearly the achievement of savings on such a scale represents a significant challenge for the county council and it is unlikely that savings on this scale can be delivered solely through increased efficiencies.

Following consideration of this report the cabinet resolved, amongst other things, to ask the county council's directorates to examine options for savings amounting to 10% of the budget and to report on the implications of such savings.
