Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about the county council's service priorities, and the council tax we charge. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and council tax.

Spending priorities

The budget for the previous year- 2009/10 - was set in February 2009 by the council's previous administration.

The new administration, elected in June 2009, then took decisions to amend some of the planned spending for that year, but left the overall budget total for 2009/10 and the council tax for the year unchanged. The new administration's plans included a commitment to have no council tax increase for the financial year 2010/11, commencing on 1 April 2010.

When the budget for 2010/11 was set in February 2010, the new administration stuck to the commitment on council tax, keeping it at the same level for the current year to 31 March 2011, as it had been in 2009/10.

In this financial year April 2010 to March 2011, the county council will spend £1,865 million (or over £1.8 billion). Of that, £1,140 million comes from the government for specific services and from charges we make for certain services; the largest item within this is a £712 million government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £725 million. The table below shows the services we will spend this on:

Council Tax

The net spending of £725 million is funded by business rates, a revenue support grant and council tax. The first two of these are fixed amounts we receive from the government. We set council tax to cover the remainder of our spending.

The table below shows our funding for 2010/11:

For 2010/11, we set a spending budget of £725 million. We received £302 million from the government, leaving £423 million to be raised from council tax. This meant an annual council tax charge of £1,108.30 for a property in band D - the same level as in the previous year. The council tax set by the county council is included together with the council tax set by your borough or district council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill, which is sent out by your borough or district council.

Next year and beyond

The county council's Cabinet met on 12 July and 9 September 2010 and considered reports on the council's financial strategy and the achievement of budget savings. The reports:

- agreed how the new coalition government's requirement for in-year savings of £22.2m would be made by the council. These savings were part of the new in-year national total of £6.2 billion announced by the government in June 2010, and were on top of the £21.7 million of efficiency savings already planned by the council as part of its 2010/11 budget; and
- set out the forecast of further total annual savings of £113 million, then estimated to be required over the three years 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14. At that stage those savings required were based on assumptions of a reduction in the county council's grant of 5% per year, and a maximum increase in council tax of 2.5%.

The Cabinet and service directors have been working on plans to make these savings to deliver a budget within the resources available, including council tax. Where possible, these savings will come from back office functions, but services may be reduced where this is unavoidable.

The government's comprehensive spending review (CSR) was published on 20 October 2010, just as this questionnaire was finalised. The initial announcements gave headline information, but we are still waiting for detailed information on government funding for the county council, so the final picture of the budget gap and the savings required to live within any given level of council tax is not yet available. The initial headline information does indicate, though, that the spending reductions required over the next three to four years will not be less than the figure noted above, and may well be significantly more, possibly increasing from £113million to £186million over the three year period. Savings of this magnitude will fundamentally alter the level and breadth of the services which the council provides.

Given the level of efficiency savings already made in the last few years, and the level of new savings now needed, it is not possible to make these from efficiency savings or from back office functions alone. Front line services will be affected by the reductions from 2011/12 onwards.
