Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about the county council's service priorities, and the council tax we charge. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and council tax.

Spending priorities

19

The council set its budget on 17 February 2011 for a three year period from 2011/12 to 2013/14. It was the first time that the council has set a three year budget and we have done this to provide stability and certainty for our communities at a time when the economic circumstances faced by local authorities are extremely challenging.

In this financial year April 2011 to March 2012, the County Council will spend £1,859 million (or over £1.8 billion). Of that, £1,090 million comes from the government for specific services and from charges we make for certain services; the largest item within this is a £817 million government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £769 million. The table below shows the services we will spend this on:

Council tax

The net spending of £769 million is funded by business rates, council tax freeze grant, a revenue support grant and council tax. The first three of these are fixed amounts we receive from the government. We set council tax to cover the remainder of our spending.

The table below shows our funding for 2011/12:

For 2011/12, we set a spending budget of £769 million. We received £344 million from the government, leaving £425 million to be raised from council tax.

This meant an annual council tax charge of £1,108.30 for a property in band D - the same level as in the previous 2 years.

The council tax set by the county council is included together with the council tax set by your borough or district council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill, which is sent out by your borough or district council.

Next year and beyond

In setting its three year budget the council identified that £179.1m savings are required in the years 2011/12 to 2013/14.

The savings required each year are shown in the table below:

A significant amount of these savings are being achieved through reducing overheads and increasing our efficiency. These are savings that don't impact on the services you receive. It was, however, inevitable that some reduction in service spending would be required to meet this target and through consultation with the county's residents the council has sought to minimise any reduction in spend on the services that you identify as being the most important to you.

This will be just as important in the future and we want to make sure we continue to recognise which services are most important to you when we plan for the coming years, so, in view of the information above
