### Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about the county council's service priorities. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and council tax.

### Spending priorities

The council set its budget on 17 February 2011 for a three year period from 2011/12 to 2013/14. It was the first time that the council has set a three year budget and we have done this to provide stability and certainty for our communities at a time when the economic circumstances faced by local authorities are extremely challenging.

In this financial year, April 2012 to March 2013, the county council will spend £1,878m (or just under £1.9bn). Of that, £1,124m comes from the government for specific services and from charges we make for certain services; the largest item within this is a £814m government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £753m. The table below shows the services we will spend this on:

#### Council tax

The net spending of £753m is funded by business rates, a revenue support grant and council tax. The first two of these are fixed amounts we receive from the government. We set council tax to cover the remainder of our spending.

The table below shows our funding for 2012/13:

For 2012/13, we set a spending budget of £753m. We received £328m from the government, leaving £425m to be raised from council tax.

This meant an annual council tax charge of £1,108.30 for a property in band D - the same level as in the previous three years.

The council tax set by the county council is included together with the council tax set by your borough or district council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill, which is sent out by your borough or district council.

### Next year and beyond

In setting its three year budget the council identified that £179.1m savings were required in the years 2011/12 to 2013/14. At its meeting in February 2012 the council revised this target to £204.5m.

The revised savings required each year are shown in the table below:

A significant amount of these savings are being achieved by reducing overheads and increasing efficiency; these are savings that don't impact on the services you receive. It was, however, inevitable that some reduction in service spending would be required to meet this target and through consultation with the county's residents the council has sought to minimise any reduction in spend on the services that you identify as being the most important to you.

In setting the budget for 2013/14 a freeze on council tax forms part of the council's proposals and as part of this process we want to make sure we continue to recognise which services are most important to you when we plan for the future, so, in view of the information above........
