## Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about the county council's service priorities. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and council tax.

#### Spending priorities

The council set its budget on 21 February 2013 for the financial year 2013-14 where the county council will spend £1.907bn. Of that, £1,131m comes from the government through grants for specific services and from charges we make for certain services; the largest item within this is an £809m government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £776m. The table below shows the services we will spend this on:

#### Council tax

The net spending of £776.3 is funded by business rates, revenue support grant, new homes bonus grant and council tax. Revenue support grant, new homes bonus and the local share of business rates are allocated by central government each year. We set council tax to cover the remainder of our spending.

The table below shows our funding for 2013/14:

For 2013/14, we set a spending budget of £776.3m. We received £416.1m from the government, leaving £360.2m to be raised from council tax.

This meant an annual council tax charge of £1,086.13 for a property in band D - 2% less than in the previous year.

The council tax set by the county council is included together with the council tax set by your borough or district council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill, which is sent out by your borough or district council.

#### Setting the budget for 2014/15 and looking ahead

Over the next four years, we estimate that as a result of rising costs and reduced funding, the county council will have to make savings of  $\pounds$ 300m, the equivalent of 38% of the current budget. Of this, some  $\pounds$ 76m of savings will have to be made in 2014/15. This is in addition to the  $\pounds$ 222m of savings that have already been delivered from 2011/12 to 2013/14.

A significant amount of the £222m savings that the county council made between 2011/12 and 2013/14 have come from reducing overheads and increasing efficiency; these are savings that don't impact on the services you receive. We remain committed to reducing our costs wherever possible. However, it is inevitable that some reduction in spending on services will be required over the next four years. Through consultation with the county's residents the council is seeking to minimise any reduction in spend on the services that you identify as being the most important to you.

We therefore want to make sure we continue to recognise which services are most important to you when we plan for the future.
