Lancashire County Council budget and priorities

We want to ask you some questions on what you think about how the county council should spend the limited amount of money it has available. First, here is some brief background information about the budget and council tax.

Spending priorities

The county council set its budget for 2014/15 in February 2014. The county council will spend £2.039bn. Of that, £1.149bn comes from the government through grants for specific services: the largest item within this is an £824m government grant to fund schools.

This leaves net spending of £758m. The table below shows how this is allocated between services:

For 2014/15, we set a spending budget of £758.3m. We received £386.1m from the Government, leaving £372.2m to be raised from council tax.

This meant an annual council tax charge of £1,107.74 for a property in band D. We set the level of our part of the council tax bill taking into account a number of factors including how much money we need, but also the impact on services of making further savings, as well as the impact on council taxpayers.

The council tax set by the county council is included together with the council tax set by your borough or district council, any parish or town council and by the police and fire authorities in one bill, which is sent out by your borough or district council.

Setting the budget for 2015/16 and looking ahead

Over the next three years, we estimate that as a result of rising costs and reduced funding, the county council will have to make savings of £176m, the equivalent of 23% of the current budget.

In total, between 2010 and 2018, the county council will have made over half a billion pounds of savings.

A significant amount of the savings that the county council has already made have come from reducing overheads and increasing efficiency; these are savings that don't impact on the services you receive. We remain committed to reducing our costs in this way wherever possible. However, it is inevitable that some reduction in spending on services will be required over the next four years. Through consultation with the county's residents the county council is seeking to minimise any reduction in spend on the services that you identify as being the most important to you.

We therefore want to make sure we continue to recognise which services are most important to you when we plan for the future.
